## What are digital assets?

- Computers and devices
- Digital files
  - Documents, photos, music, videos, etc.
- Online content
  - Email
  - Social media and online accounts
  - Data stored on the cloud
- Digital property
  - PayPal, airline miles, cryptocurrency, etc.



### Does your executor know...?

- Computer and device passwords
- Digital file locations
  - Old computers, devices, and media
  - External hard/flash drives
  - Cloud drives
- Online content
  - How many accounts?
    - Average is 150+, doubling every five years!
- Digital property
  - Any records?



## Two words: Inventory and Access

#### Inventory - where is all the stuff?

Knowing where to look is the first step – it allows you to make decisions about what to keep (or destroy), where to store it, and with whom to share it.

#### Access - how do I get to the stuff?

Your executor needs PHYSICAL access to your digital devices as well as CREDENTIALS to log on to devices/online accounts.

## Priority #1: Password Manager

#### Inventory - a list of all online accounts


Password managers help you track your accounts so that you have a running list of the sites that hold your assets/info.

#### Access - secure and current list of passwords


Password managers automatically update passwords as they are changed and hold them in a secure/encrypted account.

## Priority #2: Physical Inventory

Inventory - a list of all devices and storage locations
Whether on paper, an excel spreadsheet, or a software solution create an inventory of your gadgets and devices.

Access - designate (and train) an executor

Decide who will carry out your wishes and be sure they
understand where to look and what to do.

#### Recommend

- Grab a book like *Get It Together: Organize Your Records So Your Family Won't Have To*, which can walk you through the process of a physical inventory.


