IMPACT REPORT STATE FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024

The Larimer County Office on Aging (LCOA) is the Area Agency on Aging for Larimer County and serves adults 60 and beyond, adults living with a disability, and caregivers. LCOA plays a unique role not only to provide direct services and fund community partners, but to innovate and advocate to meet the growing needs of the community.



Outstanding Senior Volunteer 2024: Janis Markuson

Janis was celebrated during the Larimer County Office on Aging Fair during the Older American Awards in 2024. Janis selflessly provides her time to help others in her community apply for benefits, drive to doctor's appointments, and even fix various items around the house. Her neighbors and their families recognize her loving spirit!

Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC)

The Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC) is a trusted source of information for older adults, persons living with a disability, and their caregivers to obtain assistance in planning for their future long-term service and support needs. The ADRC is designed to empower older adults and persons living with a disability to make informed choices about their services and supports. Staff at the ADRC provide objective information and assistance to help people access private or publicly funded programs.

AGING AND DISABILITY RESOURCE CENTER (ADRC) DIRECT SUPPORT

68 individuals received hands-on assistance in completing a Long-Term Care Medicaid or Medicare Savings Program Application.

90 individuals received one-on-one decision-making assistance to access and navigate long-term services and supports.

5,998 incoming contacts were received requesting assistance, **500** incoming contacts per month on average.

VOUCHER PROGRAMS

116 individuals received **4,977 hours** of homemaker and personal care services.

110 individuals received a chore voucher providing financial support with chores around the home that they were unable to perform, equaling a total of **31,705**.

66 individuals received **\$40,429** in financial support for dental/oral health services.

FAMILY CAREGIVER SUPPORT PROGRAM

94 caregivers received respite support valued at **\$121,152**.

151 caregivers received individual caregiver consult sessions and 432 referrals to caregiver resources were provided over the phone or email.

16 grand families received respite support valued at **\$14,362.50**.

35 caregivers participated in the evidence-based classes Powerful Tools for Caregivers and Stress-Busting Program for Family Caregivers.

LCOA has an advisory council composed of community members and representatives from community organizations. Thank you to the council members for their time, effort, and dedication to making Larimer County a great place for older adults to live and thrive.

The Ombudsman Program

The Ombudsman team protects the rights of individuals living in nursing and assisted living homes. Larimer County has four full-time paid Ombudsmen and three volunteers who serve residents in **50 different long-term care communities**.

3,061 individual beds were protected by the Ombudsman Program.

622 visits were made to long-term care communities, **946** complaints were investigated, and **491** cases were opened.

273 consultations with facilities and **474 consultations** with residents/families.

40 sessions of community training and **4 sessions** of facility training were provided.



Grant-Funded Community Programs

The Office on Aging funds services through a network of partner agencies. More than **\$1.6 million** was awarded to **28 community organizations** in support of programs and services.

13 individuals received **2,114 hours** of supervised personal care, group engagement, and more through adult day programs.

738 individuals received **78,713** home delivered meals.

534 individuals received **19,248** congregate/grab-n-go meals.

86 clients received low vision services.

805 hours of legal assistance.

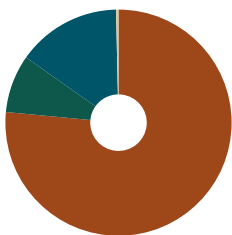

Funding

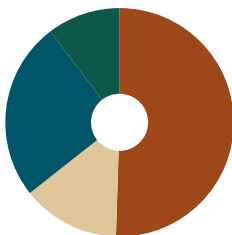

A trusted, free source of information on long-term services and support options in Larimer County. Information and referrals to programs, services, and resources for older adults, caregivers and adults living with a disability as well as help navigating options. Anyone may contact the ADRC regardless of immigration status.

Options Counseling

One-on-one personalized decision-making assistance to help individuals and their families understand, access, and navigate the long-term service and support system including understanding Long Term Care Medicaid eligibility and the application process, public assistance programs, in-home and community care options, and community resources and services. Support can be provided via phone calls, in-person home visits, or a video conferencing platform. Appointments are required.

Transition Services

Counseling for individuals with Long Term Care Medicaid benefits who currently reside in a skilled nursing home in Larimer County and want to explore their options of moving back to the community.

Application Assistance

Provided to help individuals complete and submit an application for Long Term Care Medicaid and/or Medicare Savings Programs benefits. Support can be provided via phone calls, in-person home visits, or a video conferencing platform. Appointments are required.

Chore Voucher Program

The chore voucher program is a self-directed reimbursement program that provides some financial support for adults 60+ residing in Larimer County who need assistance with household chores.

In-Home Services Voucher Program

Provides light housekeeping and personal care for adults 60+ living in Larimer County who need assistance in their home due to cognitive and/or physical limitations. The Office on Aging contracts with local home care agencies who provide the services. Call for more information about this program

Family Caregiver Support Program

Support for adults providing informal care to a partner, parent, or other family member. Services include individual consultations, respite assistance, and connections to support groups, counseling and classes. Support can be provided via phone calls, in-person home visits, or a video conferencing platform. Appointments are required.

Caregiver Respite Voucher Program

For caregivers who are providing informal in-home care to an adult age 60 or older, or to an individual with Alzheimer's disease or related neurocognitive disorders. The intent of the Respite Voucher is to alleviate the stresses associated with being a caregiver.

Grand Family Respite Voucher Program

For caregivers 55 years or older providing informal in-home care who are grandparent(s), step-grandparent(s), or older adult(s) who are relative caregivers of a child by blood, marriage, or adoption. The child must be seventeen (17) years old or younger. The intent of the Grand Family Respite Voucher is to alleviate the stresses associated with being a caregiver.

Long-Term Care Ombudsman - Larimer County Office on Aging

A team of trained, certified and experienced advocates who investigate and resolve complaints regarding resident rights, quality of life, and quality of care in assisted living and skilled nursing communities. Provides assistance to individuals who are choosing a long-term care home and offers education about navigating the long-term care system.

Adult Protective Services (APS)

APS investigates allegations of physical and sexual abuse, caretaker neglect, exploitation and harmful acts (collectively referred to as “mistreatment”) and self-neglect of at-risk adults. APS offers protective services to improve the health, safety, and welfare of at-risk adults experiencing mistreatment or self-neglect. APS uses community-based services and resources, health care services, family and friends when appropriate, and other support systems while protecting the at-risk adult’s right to confidentiality, self-determination, and least-restrictive intervention.

CLASSES FOR CAREGIVERS



Powerful Tools for Caregivers

A program for family caregivers designed to help caregivers take care of themselves while caring for a friend or relative. Provides tools to better communicate feelings, deal with difficult emotions and helps caregivers find relevant resources. The class meets weekly for six weeks.

Stress-Busting for Family Caregivers

A nine-week program focused on reducing stress for those caring for a person living with dementia or a chronic illness. Small groups meet weekly focusing on stress management techniques, relaxation, and coping strategies.

PUBLIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Old Age Pension (OAP)

Old Age Pension provides financial assistance to residents ages 60 or older with little or no income. It may also provide medical assistance for eligible applicants. Eligibility and benefit amounts are based upon the individual’s income and resources.

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Food Assistance Program (970) 498-6300

SNAP is a food assistance program in Colorado that provides food benefits to low-income individuals. Benefits are issued on an electronic benefit transfer (EBT) card which can be used at most grocery stores and some farmers markets to buy food. To apply for SNAP/food assistance, apply online through Colorado.gov/PEAK

Aid to the Needy Disabled (AND)

Colorado’s Aid to the Needy Disabled (State AND) program provides a cash payment to qualified residents who are between the ages of 18-59, a United States citizen or a legal resident of the United States, a resident of Colorado, cooperate with alcohol or controlled substance programs, remain substance free if your disability primary diagnosis is drug or alcohol addiction and have been, or expect to be totally disabled for six months or more. MEDICAID / HEALTH FIRST COLORADO

Medicaid Buy-In Program (970) 498-6300

Medicaid Buy-In Program for Working Adults with Disabilities (970) 498-6300

Program allows adults with a disability who qualify to “buy-into” Colorado Medicaid. If you work and earn too much to qualify for Colorado Medicaid, you may qualify for this program. If you qualify, you pay a monthly premium which is based on your income. Call for more information.

Long Term Care Medicaid

Includes nursing facility care and Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) (where medical providers come into the home or assisted living community to render the necessary services to keep a disabled individual from being institutionalized in a nursing facility). To apply for Long Term Care Medicaid, mark the medical assistance box on the application.

HOME & COMMUNITY BASED SERVICES (HCBS) WAIVERS

A waiver is an extra set of Health First Colorado (Colorado’s Medicaid Program) benefits that you may qualify for in certain cases. These benefits can help you remain in your home and community.

Brain Injury Waiver (BI)*

For individuals with a brain injury who need extra support to live in their communities.

Community Mental Health Supports Waiver (CMHS)*

Provides assistance to people with a mental illness that require long-term supports and services in order to remain in a community setting.

Developmental Disabilities Waiver (DD)

For persons with a developmental disability. Provides access to 24/7 supervision through residential habilitation and day habilitation services and supports.

Elderly, Blind, & Disabled Waiver (EBD)*

Provides assistance for people age 65 and older who have a functional impairment or are blind, and to people ages 18-64 who are physically disabled or have a diagnosis of HIV or AIDS, and require long-term supports and services in order to remain in a community setting.

Complementary & Integrative Health (CIH)*

For persons living with a spinal cord injury, multiple sclerosis, brain injury, spina bifida, muscular dystrophy or cerebral palsy with the inability for independent ambulation over the age of 18.

Supported Living Services Waiver (SLS)*

Provides necessary services and supports for adults with an intellectual or developmental disability so they can remain in their homes and communities.

** Optional Consumer-Directed Attendant Support Services (CDASS) - Allows for the direction and management of the attendants who provide personal care, homemaker and health maintenance services, rather than working through an agency. CDASS empowers the client to hire, train, and manage attendants of their choice to best fit their unique needs. These responsibilities can be delegated to an authorized representative.*

Advance directives are written instructions recognized under state law that can be used at any stage of life to ensure that the medical treatment you receive is consistent with your wishes and preferences should you be unable to make your own decisions. MEDICARE

Medicare is a health insurance program for people 65+, those under age 65 with qualifying disabilities or any individual with end-stage renal disease. If you do not have credible coverage, you must apply for Medicare benefits the month before you turn 65. You can apply for Medicare 3 months before turning 65 years old.

Medicare Part A (Hospital Insurance)

Monthly premiums for Part A coverage is typically not required if you or your spouse paid Medicare taxes while working. If Medicare taxes were not paid, Part A coverage can be purchased which would require a monthly premium. Part A benefits include:

- Skilled nursing facility care (for rehab services)
- Hospice care
- Home health care

Medicare Part B (Medical Insurance)

Part B benefits include:

Services from doctors and other Health care providers

- Outpatient care

- Some preventative services

Medicare Part C (Medicare Advantage)

Managed by Medicare-approved private insurance companies. Includes:

- All benefits and services covered under Part A and Part B (some co-payments and deductible may vary, and you may be required to use in-network providers)
- Usually includes Medicare prescription drug coverage (Part D) as part of the plan
- May include extra benefits and services for an extra cost

Medicare Part D (Medicare prescription drug coverage)

Managed by Medicare-approved private insurance companies. Helps cover the cost of prescription drug. May help lower your prescription drug costs and help protect against higher costs in the future (if you do not enroll in a Part D plan when you become eligible for Medicare benefits and enroll at a later time, you will be subject to penalties and your premiums will be higher).

Low Income Subsidy (LIS) - Also known as Extra Help with Medicare Part D

For individuals who receive Part D prescription drug coverage and are low income, there is assistance available for the costs of deductibles and copays. This extra help is also known as the Low-Income Subsidy (LIS).
